Major changes in the second Germanic consonant shift

proto-sound	After vowels	Elsewhere
*p	f	pf
* <i>t</i>	S	ts
* <i>k</i>	X	k (but kx in some dialects)
*d	t	t

Notice that * indicates the proto-form in reconstruction analyses.

So, now compare Modern English, which did not undergo the shift, and Modern German, which did undergo the shift:

Modern English	Modern German
o p en	offen
p ath	pf ad
bite	beissen
to	z u (z is pronounced ts)
book	Bu ch (ch is pronounced x)
come	kommen
ri d e	rei t en
door	Tür

As usual, notice the pronunciation here, and not the spelling, though in many of these examples the spelling does reflect the pronunciation.
