"Miss Flossie J. Parker was the moving figure in the organization of the project which has the full cooperation of Mrs. Annie Bowling, WPA project supervisor and Miss Marjorie Beal, secretary and director of the North Carolina Library Commission.

"The library open five days a week, had 152 visitors, during the first three days of its operation and loaned 51 books. An appeal is being made for additional volumes and magazines.

"Possibility of the library continuing after its WPA support has ceased, becoming a branch of the regular public library, loomed."
