

In August my duties were increased to include the supervision of material prepared on Negroes by the Information Service Division. A Negro Assistant was appointed in the Information Service Division to work in cooperation with this office.

A Negro Press mailing list was prepared and news releases relating to the Works Progress Administration and many of the other Works Program agencies were mailed out each week. Pictures and mats were included when advisable. Response of the Press was immediate, and the Works Progress Administration had, without a doubt, the best coverage of any agency. A file of press clippings has been established and is kept up to date; it includes every type of Works Progress Administration and related material.

In answer to numerous requests during the political campaign period a pamphlet was prepared "Interesting Facts About The Negro And The WPA". This was made available to the general public, and was given wide distribution. Numerous individual and special requests for information were filled during this period.

The March issue of the Federal Emergency Relief Administration's Monthly Report contained my article "The Negro and Relief". It was made available to the general public and received considerable favorable comment, being reproduced by the Negro Press and the Scripps-Howard dailies.
