

Mr. Lawson, of the Information Service, prepared magazine articles, some of a non-racial character; one of these published in the 'Parents' Magazine was "Building Future Citizens". A school lunch article "Soups On", was published in the December Crisis Magazine.

An information letter was mailed twice monthly to a selected mailing list of about twenty Negroes in key positions. These persons are for the most part heads of National Negro organizations. The information enclosed consisted of material likely to be of value to Negroes in securing benefits under the program, and in aiding in maximum administration efficiency.

A moving picture of Negro subjects and activities in the Works Progress Administration was prepared by the Pathe News Company under my general supervision. I spent the greater part of October in New York City supervising its preparation. It was distributed late in October, and has been showing since in Negro Theatres throughout the country. Distribution is being handled by a private firm.

A Negro Press Digest was prepared each week and sent to Division heads in the Federal Works Progress Administration.

Records of interesting phases of Negro participation in State Works Progress Administration programs were sent in by nearly all of the State Administrators, at my request in November and December. This material constitutes the most complete record of Negro activities in the Works Progress Administration available. It contains statistics, narratives, and photographs, and is used
