

# Hockey improves to 10-5

After a victory over the University of Vermont, the women suffered a 5-2 loss on their home ice, despite two goals by Parks and assists by Jen Hefner and Janice O'Neil. "We wanted this [B.C.] game real bad, and we played well; only the little things hurt us quite a bit," commented assistant coach Kelly Hefner.

The women closed out the recent streak of games with a characteristic 5-0 slaughter of Williams. Parks struck again with two goals and an assist. Hefner had one goal and one assist, while O'Neil recorded a goal

and a pair of assists. Elizabeth "Libby" Zug '97 recorded her first ever college goal.

"[Christy] Picard has been playing well. She was huge in the net against Boston College, and has come up big on a few occasions," coach Hefner added. Picard is .500 in the net for her career (35-35), recording a save percentage of .866, with 17 career shutouts. In the meantime, Parks and Hefner are closing in on the scoring record books. Parks has 61 career goals and 47 assists. Hefner's totals are equally impressive at 54 goals and 69 assists.

Overall, the women are performing well, on their way to a 10-5 record overall. Right now, they're looking forward to match-ups with Colby, Amherst, and Wesleyan.
